

California Ballot Proposition Recommendations

Number	Vote	Reason
1A	NO	Most expensive railroad in history. This proposition provides no requirement that any rail actually be laid. We can't afford more bonds!
2	NO	Will probably be a major problem for egg industry, which will cause a large increase in the price of eggs. There must be a better way to prevent cruelty to animals!
3	NO	Not limited to children's hospitals. Money for that purpose from an earlier bond hasn't even been spent. We can't afford more bonds!
